□ Choose a veterinarian and schedule your first puppy check-up		
□ Buy a puppy training book or guide to get prepared		
□ Buy high-quality puppy food recommended by your vet or breeder		
□ Pick up no-flip bowls for food and water		
□ Choose an adjustable collar and leash		
□ Order a Pet ID tag		
□ Select a cozy puppy bed, crate, and blanket		
□ Create a secure pet space (playpen or play space)		
□ Stock up on a variety of toys to discover what your pup likes best		
□ Choose teething chews and safe chew sticks		
$\hfill\square$ Gather poop bags, potty pads, and cleaning supplies (My Pet Peed is a life sav	/er)	
□ Find small, soft training treats for rewards		
□ Secure pet potty space (check fences and gates)		
First Week With Your Puppy		
□ Take your puppy to the vet for a full exam		
□ Start your puppy's vaccination schedule in a book or on your smart phone		
□ Ask your vet about parasite prevention and flea/tick treatments		
□ Begin teaching your puppy their name and rewarding response		
□ Hand feed your puppy multiple meals to begin bonding		
□ Start crate training with blanket to introduce day and night schedule		
□ Establish a feeding routine with 3–4 small meals per day measuring food		
□ Begin gentle training sessions using positive reinforcement		
□ Schedule playtimes, short walks, and nap times		
□ Socialize your puppy safely by introducing new sounds and environments		
□ Introduce puppies to car rides as part of daily routines		
□ Keep a puppy bag ready for vet visits, outings, and emergencies		
□ Let you puppy spend individual time with each member of the family		
During Year One		
□ Complete all puppy vaccination rounds on schedule		
□ Schedule your puppy's spay or neuter based on vet recommendations		
□ Keep up with flea, tick, and heartworm prevention		
□ Continue crate training and increase freedom as your pup learns		
□ Begin leash training and practice calm walking skills		
□ Work on core commands like sit, stay, come, leave it, and drop it		
□ Enroll in a puppy training class or join a local obedience group		
□ Socialize your puppy regularly with other dogs, people, and environments		
□ Upgrade your puppy's collar and gear as they grow		
□ Transition to adult food when recommended by your vet		
□ Schedule a wellness exam around your puppy's first birthday to check growth	, weight, a	and development
□ Continue using positive reinforcement to encourage good habits		
□ Rotate toys and chews to keep playtime fun and mentally stimulating		

□ Track milestones like first successful walks, nights without accidents, and training progress
